# Why Do We Celebrate Harvest?

Harvest festivals are believed to date back to ancient Britain when most people planted and grew their own food in fields and farmers would give thanks for a good harvest.

Farmers gave thanks for a good harvest during the full moon closest to the autumn equinox, it was important to them because it meant they could store the food and eat well through the hard winter months.

Harvest Festival celebrates the time of year when crops have been gathered from the field and people can reflect on the food that they have.

The celebrations became popular again in Victorian times as a kind of 'thanksgiving' service, including prayer and church services.

While we don't all grow our own food anymore, Harvest festivals are still considered an important way to learn about the process of how food gets from farms to our tables, as well as being a key date in the calendar of different religions.

#### Luke 8 v. 4 - 15 NIV

4 While a large crowd was gathering and people were coming to Jesus from town after town, he told this parable: 5 "A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path; it was trampled on, and the birds ate it up. 6 Some fell on rocky ground, and when it came up, the plants withered because they had no moisture. 7 Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up with it and choked the plants. 8 Still other seed fell on good soil. It came up and yielded a crop, a hundred times more than was sown." When he said this, he called out, "Whoever has ears to hear, let them hear." 9 His disciples asked him what this parable meant. 10 He said, "The knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of God has been given to you, but to others I speak in parables, so that, "though seeing, they may not see; though hearing, they may not understand.' 11 "This is the meaning of the parable: The seed is the word of God. 12 Those along the path are the ones who hear, and then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, so that they may not believe and be saved. 13 Those on the rocky ground are the ones who receive the word with joy when they hear it, but they have no root. They believe for a while, but in the time of

testing they fall away. 14 The seed that fell among thorns

stands for those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by life's worries, riches and pleasures, and they do not mature. 15 But the seed on good soil stands for those

## Church Together Thought

#### THE FARMER

As the farmer walked along, he scattered the wheat seeds. Lots of grains of wheat fell to the ground. (**Demonstrate again.**)

A generous supply was sown with the potential to grow into healthy wheat plants.

What happened to the seeds depended on where the seed fell. Some of it fell on the path and got eaten, some of it was choked by other plants as it grew, and the seed which fell on rocks started growing but then shrivelled up.

However, some seeds that germinated went on to grow tall and strong, producing a great harvest!

#### **GOD'S MESSAGE**

What happens to the seed, Jesus said, is like what happens to God's word, his message to us:

God is a generous God and he has '**scattered**' his word in abundance; he has not held back

from making sure his message is heard. He is not ruled by cost - benefit analysis but by a huge

outreaching generosity of his love and compassion for all who would believe in him.

What happens to the seed - God's message - depends on how it is received. This story is not just about the seed, but also about the soil it falls into. For example, God's word may be lost because our hearts are not centred on God; God's word may not last - when the going gets tough, it withers away; God's word may be squeezed out by cares or worries that we have, or because of our desire for pleasures or riches.

#### **GOOD SOIL**

The seed that fell on good soil however, produced tall plants, which grew strongly and bore much fruit. This, Jesus said, is a picture of the sort of people who hear the word of God and respond to God's message; hold on to it with an honest and good heart; and keep going until they bear fruit as we read in **Luke 8 v. 15**.

So, in the same way as harvest reminds us of our need to respond to God, this parable points us to respond to what he says, that we need to let the word of God fall into our hearts and lives, so that we become fruitful people of God.

#### **HOW TO BE FRUITFUL**

To be fruitful people of God, fulfilling our potential and pleasing God we need to do the following:

Hear what he says - this means being prepared to listen when we hear the Bible read or read it for ourselves.

To mull over what we read or hear, thinking out what it means to us, honestly and sincerely.

Go on following God's word, even when life becomes difficult or we feel we are just plodding on.

To sum up, we are to firstly, hear it, secondly, we need to

think about it and finally, we must live it out in the lives that we live.
